Scripture reflection: Psalm 104

Pray the [Prayer of St Francis](#) before you reflect on the scripture.

Psalm 104 is often called the 'Psalm of God the Creator'. It links with *Laudato Si – On Care for our Common Home*, an encyclical written by Pope Francis which asks us to commit ourselves to love and appreciate the magnificent gift of the earth, our common home, and to take care of all members of the human family.
